

743 FIREFIGHTER TO DIE IN THE LINE OF DUTY - BOX 460

FIREFIGHTER PHIL D'ADAMO WAS BORN AND RAISED IN THE BOROUGH OF BROOKLYN NEW YORK. PHIL WAS THE SON OF ANNE AND MICHAEL D'ADAMO AND BROTHER OF DOMINICK, WHO LIVED FOR MANY YEARS ON UNION STREET IN THE CARROLL GARDENS SECTION OF BROOKLYN. FIREFIGHTER D'ADAMO WENT TO OUR LADY OF PEACE GRAMMAR SCHOOL AND ST. AUGUSTINE

HIGH SCHOOL WHERE HE GRADUATED WITH AN ACADEMIC DEGREE IN 1966.

IMMEDIATELY UPON HIS GRADUATION, PHIL KNEW HE HAD A SPECIAL CALLING, THAT WAS TO HELP OTHERS. FF. D'ADAMO ENLISTED INTO THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORP. WHERE HE WENT THROUGH EXTENSIVE TRAINING AT PARIS ISLAND AND LATER WAS ASSIGNED TO CAMP PENDELTON FOR HIS REMAINING TOUR OF DUTY.

AFTER LEAVING THE U.S. MARINE CORP., HE MOVED BACK TO BROOKLYN AND STARTED WORKING IN THE FINANCIAL DISTRICT IN MANHATTAN IT WAS DURING THIS TIME, THAT ON NOVEMBER 22, 1970 HE MARRIED HIS LIFELONG SWEETHEART GRACE GUCCIONE. PHIL THEN WENT TO WORK FOR MERRILL LYNCH AS AN ORDER CLERK AND IT WAS AT THIS TIME, HE AGAIN GOT THAT SPECIAL CALLING AND ON AUGUST 31, 1973 HE WENT TO WORK FOR THE N.Y.C. POLICE DEPARTMENT.. DURING THIS TIME PHIL WAS DOING WHAT HE DID BEST—HELPING OTHERS. POLICE OFFICER D'ADAMO WAS ASSIGNED TO MIDTOWN NORTH AND THE **60 PRECINCT**.

PHIL D'ADAMO FOUND THAT HIS CALLING CHANGED
SLIGHTLY A FEW YEARS AFTER HIS FIRST CHILD WAS BORN.

. PHIL'S OLDEST SON STARTED PLAYING BASEBALL FOR THE NEIGHBORHOOD PARISH, REGINA PACIS AND PHIL BECAME HEAVILY INVOLVED WITH THE LOCAL LITTLE LEAGUE. INSTEAD OF WEARING JUST A BADGE AND GUN, HE ALSO WORE A BASEBALL HAT AND SHIRT WHICH BORE THE WORDS — COACH. PHIL HIMSELF WAS AN AVID SPORTSMAN. IN GRAMMAR SCHOOL HE PLAYED FOOTBALL AND IN HIGH SCHOOL HE RAN TRACK, A VERY USEFUL SPORT NOW THAT HE WAS A POLICE OFFICER.

IN 1978, PHIL DECIDED TO MOVE TO STATEN ISLAND AND CONTINUE HIS COMMUNITY WORK IN THIS BOROUGH. HE COACHED THE STATEN ISLAND PEE WEE LITTLE LEAGUE BASEBALL TEAM, AND A YEAR LATER, BEGAN COACHING THE PEE WEE FOOTBALL LEAGUE.

ON SEPT. 28, 1977, THAT SPECIAL CALLING AGAIN CAME
TO PHIL AND HE TRADED IN HIS GUN AND SHIELD FOR A NEW
BADGE, THE BADGE OF THE BRAVEST-THE NEW YORK CITY FIRE
DEPARTMENT. PROBATIONARY FIREFIGHTER D'ADAMO WENT FOR
6 WEEKS OF TRAINING AT RANDALL'S ISLAND AND ON NOVEMBER
5, 1977, FF. D'ADAMO WAS ASSIGNED TO LADDER COMPANY 118 IN
BROOKLYN HEIGHTS.

IN THE SEVEN YEARS THAT FF. D'ADAMO WAS ASSIGNED TO LADDER COMPANY 118, HE ACCOMPLISHED MANY OBJECTIVES. AT THE TIME OF HIS DEMISE, PHIL WAS ONE OF THE SENIOR MEMBERS IN THE COMPANY. HE WAS A VERY KNOWLEDGEABLE AND CONSCIENTIOUS FIREFIGHTER. AND A POSITIVE INFLUENCE ON THE YOUNGER MEMBERS IN THE HOUSE. HE WAS A REGULAR ASSIGNED CHAUFFEUR OF LADDER COMPANY 118 AND WAS OPERATING IN THIS POSITION THAT DREADFUL NIGHT. HIS COMMITMENT DID NOT END THERE HOWEVER, FF. D'ADAMO WAS A DRIVING FORCE BEHIND THE ANNUAL FIREHOUSE CHRISTMAS PARTIES FOR CHILDREN IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD. HAVING THREE CHILDREN OF HIS OWN, HE WANTED TO HELP OTHERS PEOPLE'S KIDS TOO. HIS GOOD NATURE WAS A NOTED PART OF THE FIREHOUSE. FF. D'ADAMO WAS AN ETERNAL PRACTICAL JOKER. HE TURNED EVERYTHING UPSIDE DOWN. THE LAST ACT THAT FF. D'ADAMO PERFORMED WAS TO TURN THE FIREHOUSE KITCHEN CLOCK UPSIDE DOWN, TODAY THE CLOCK STILL UPSIDE DOWN—A LASTING MEMORY TO PHIL.

ON DECEMBER 1. 1984, FF. PHIL D'ADAMO SUCCUMBED TO
HIS INJURIES AT BOX 460 WHILE PERFORMING A SEARCH FOR
POSSIBLE VICTIMS ONE FLOOR ABOVE THE BURNING AUDITORIUM

AT ST. ANN'S SCHOOL, LOCATED AT 127 PIERREPONT STREET.

FF. D'ADAMO IS SURVIVED BY HIS WIFE AND THREE
CHILDREN LIVING IN STATEN ISLAND. HE PROVIDED WELL FOR HIS
FAMILY. EACH CHILD ATTENDED AND GRADUATED ST. ANN'S
ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, ST. JOSEPH'S BY THE SEA HIGH SCHOOL
AND ALL WENT ON TO COLLEGE. A FITTING TRIBUTE TO FF. PHIL
D'ADAMO WAS THE EULOGY GIVEN BY THE FIRE DEPARTMENT'S
CHAPLAIN, MSGR., THOMAS BRADY WHO DESCRIBED A SCENE
FROM THE FAMOUS NOVEL," TO KILL A MOCKING BIRD" HE SAID A
LAWYER IN A SMALL SOUTHERN TOWN LOST A TRIAL, BUT THE

I am writing to express my support for Intro 845, sponsored by Councilmember Kenneth Fisher.

This bill, currently before the City Council's Parks Committee, would rename Middagh Street, between Hicks and Henry Streets, in Brooklyn, in honor of New York City Firefighter Philip D'Adamo.

Firefighter Philip D'Adamo, a native of Brooklyn and a respected public servant who had previously served our city as a police officer and our country as Marine, died in the line of duty on December 1, 1984 after responding to a fire at the St. Ann's School in the Brooklyn Heights section of Brooklyn. Intro 845 would rename the street in front of Ladder Company 118 where Firefighter D'Adamo was assigned from the day of his graduation to the day of his untimely death.

It is a most fitting honor to create a visual remembrance at this location to commemorate the dedicated service of Firefighter Philip D'Adamo. I strongly urge the City Council to bestow this most appropriate honor.

INTENT:

This legislation would add, through the posting of an additional sign, the name "Philip D'Adamo Place," on Middagh Street between Henry Street and Hicks

Street.

COMMENT:

Philip D'Adamo was born to Anne and Michael D'Adamo on July 12, 1949 in Brooklyn. He attended Our Lady of Peace Grammar School, where he played football, and graduated from Saint Augustine High School in 1966, where he ran track. After graduation Philip D'Adamo enlisted in the United States Marine Corps, underwent extensive training at Parris Island and was then assigned to Camp Pendleton for his remaining tour of duty. Upon his discharge, he moved back to Brooklyn and began

working in Manhattan's financial district. Philip D'Adamo married his longtime sweetheart Grace Guccione on November 22, 1970.

Philip D'Adamo enjoyed helping others and decided to join the New York City
Police Department to which he was appointed on August 31, 1973. He was assigned to
Midtown North and the 60th Precinct in Brooklyn. A little later in life, on September
28, 1977, he decided to turn in his gun and shield for a new badge, the badge of the
New York City Fire Department. He completed six weeks of training at the Fire
Department's training center on Randall's Island and on November 5, 1977 was
assigned to Ladder Company 118 in Brooklyn Heights.

During his seven years with the Fire Department he accomplished many objectives. A conscientious firefighter, he became one of the senior members in Ladder Company 118 and was a positive influence on the younger members of the Company. He was also the driving force behind the annual firehouse Christmas parties for children in the neighborhood.

During his leisure time, Philip D'Adamo enjoyed sports. When his oldest son Michael, started playing baseball for the neighborhood parish, Philip D'Adamo became heavily involved with the local Little League and became a coach during his off-duty hours. In 1978, when the D'Adamo family moved to Staten Island, he continued to work with the youth of his new community by coaching the Staten Island Pee Wee Little League and eventually the Pee Wee Football League.

Sadly, on December 1, 1984, Firefighter Philip D'Adamo succumbed to injuries suffered while searching for possible victims on the floor above the burning auditorium of Saint Ann's School in Brooklyn. He was survived by his wife and three children, Michael, Anthony and Stephanie.

As a tribute to the life and sacrifice of Philip D'Adamo, this legislation names

Middagh Street between Henry Street and Hicks Street, where Ladder Company 118 is
located, as "Philip D'Adamo Place."



FIREFIGHTER PHIL D'ADAMO WAS BORN AND RAISED IN THE BOROUGH OF BROOKLYN NEW YORK. PHIL WAS THE SON OF ANNE AND MICHAEL D'ADAMO AND BROTHER OF DOMINICK WHO LIVED FOR MANY YEARS ON UNION STREET IN THE CARROLL GARDENS SECTION OF BROOKLYN. FIREFIGHTER D'ADAMO WENT

HIGH SCHOOL WHERE HE GRADUATED WITH AN ACADEMIC DEGREE IN 1966.

IMMEDIATELY UPON HIS GRADUATION, PHIL KNEW HE HAD A SPECIAL CALLING, THAT WAS TO HELP OTHERS. FF. D'ADAMO ENLISTED INTO THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORP. WHERE HE WENT THROUGH EXTENSIVE TRAINING AT PARIS ISLAND AND LATER WAS ASSIGNED TO CAMP PENDELTON FOR HIS REMAINING TOUR OF DUTY.

AFTER LEAVING THE U.S. MARINE CORP., HE MOVED BACK TO BROOKLYN AND STARTED WORKING IN THE FINANCIAL DISTRICT IN MANHATTAN IT WAS DURING THIS TIME, THAT ON NOVEMBER 22, 1970 HE MARRIED HIS LIFELONG SWEETHEART GRACE GUCCIONE.

BROOKLYN HEIGHTS.

HE WAS A VERY KNOWLEDGEABLE AND CONSCIENTIOUS FIREFIGHTER. AND A POSITIVE INFLUENCE ON THE YOUNGER MEMBERS IN THE HOUSE. HE WAS A REGULAR ASSIGNED CHAUFFEUR OF LADDER COMPANY 118 AND WAS OPERATING IN THIS POSITION THAT DREADFUL NIGHT. HIS COMMITMENT DID NOT END THERE HOWEVER, FF. D'ADAMO WAS A DRIVING FORCE BEHIND THE ANNUAL FIREHOUSE CHRISTMAS PARTIES FOR CHILDREN IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD. HAVING THREE CHILDREN OF HIS OWN, HE WANTED TO HELP OTHERS PEOPLE'S KIDS TOO.
