CREATED AND SUSTAINED ONE OF OUR
CITY'S MOST REMARKABLE ATTAINMENTS.

CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF
THE FESTIVAL FOR FIVE YEARS. HE HAS
POURED HIS SINGULAR TALENTS AND
ENERGIES INTO THE MAMMOTH TASK OF
MAINTAINING A FAR-REACHING CULTURAL
ENTERPRISE, AND HE HAS DONE SO
WITHOUT SEEKING HONORS OR CREDIT.
